Enforcement Appeal: Haresfoot Farm

Chesham Road Berkhamsted

Mr Hugo Keating has appealed to the Secretary of State against the enforcement notice issued by the council concerning:-

Without planning permission, erection of new buildings and intensification of industrial uses at the site

However, the notice will not take effect until the appeal has been determined and only if the decision is to dismiss the appeal.

Mr Hugo Keating has appealed on the grounds:

Ground A That planning permission should be granted for what is alleged in the notice.

Ground C That there has not been a breach of planning control (for example because permission has already been granted, or it is "permitted development").

Ground D That, at the time the enforcement notice was issued, it was too late to take enforcement action against the matters stated in the notice.

Ground F The steps required to comply with the requirements of the notice are excessive, and lesser steps would overcome the objections.

Ground G The time given to comply with the notice is too short. These are grounds from the Section 174(2) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (As Amended).

It will be open to the Secretary of State to grant planning permission.

This appeal will be decided by an Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State at an Informal hearing and I will inform you of the hearing details as soon as they are available.
